Palm Sunday Procession – Monday 14th April

We invite all parents to join us at 9:15am as we celebrate Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem.

- **KS2** will lead the procession, waving palms and shouting "Hosanna" as they walk through the streets around school: out of the gates, down Brarley Street, onto Summer Lane, onto New John Street West, and back to school.
- **KS1 and Reception** will line up in the playground, leaving a gap for Jesus to walk through, waiting for the arrival of Jesus when KS2 returns.
- **Weather permitting**, we will process around the field, following Jesus as Pilgrims of Hope.

Holy Thursday – Stations of the Cross

- Parents are invited to join us at 2:30pm for a special walk through the **Stations of the Cross**.

Year 5 Swimming

To ensure they are fully prepared, boys will need to wear trunks or swimming shorts, and girls should wear a one-piece swimming costume along with a swimming hat.

Opportunities for Confession will be on Monday & Tuesday of Holy Week from 11am until 12 noon before the 12.15 Mass. Please note there will be NO confessions on Wednesday 16th April or throughout the Easter Triduum.

Thursday of the Lord's Supper 17th April (Maundy Thursday)

7.30pm Mass of the Lord's Supper. The Blessed Sacrament will be reposed in the Lady Chapel until 11pm for silent Prayer and Contemplation - watching with Christ on the Night before his Crucifixion 11pm Night Prayer of the Church (Compline)

3.00pm The Celebration of the Passion of the Lord.

The narrative of the Lord's Passion according to St. John concludes with the Solemn Intercessions followed by the Showing & Adoration of the Holy Cross. Holy Communion is distributed. As we leave the Cathedral in silence we genuflect to the Cross.
